

The Role of China in Afghan Peace Process: An Evaluation of News of International Media

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Abstract

The geostrategic position of Afghanistan in the world has made it a center of concern to all the regional and global powers. Consequently, the region is also being a hotbed of issues throughout the history. China as a regional economic and global soft power has played a significant role in the region and also make admirable efforts throughout, in building and maintaining Peace in Afghanistan. The research is a qualitative analysis of role of China in Afghan Peace through the assessment of news disseminated in international media. The economic aspects of China and Afghan relations are also discussed in it, side by side the role of media in the whole process. The article explains that China has a number of interests in Afghanistan so, peace is Afghanistan is of prime importance for China. Among the main interests are the economic interests and security interests that China has in this region. By achieving these interests China can take more benefits in its BRI project and also in maintaining peace in own Xinjiang region.

China is Afghanistan's most important neighboring country. Afghanistan and China share a 76-kilometer border. Currently, the world's fastest-growing economic and military force in China, which has a total population of over 1.3 billion people. In Afghanistan, China has significant economic, security, and political interests. Afghanistan's natural resources are of great interest to China. China is pursuing stronger ties with Afghanistan through regional organizations, the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC), and the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO). China is attempting to bring peace to Afghanistan for the country to benefit economically from Chinese knowledge. Because militancy in Afghanistan hinders China's internal security, China strives for a peaceful Afghanistan. (Kaura, 2020)

Peace is a crucial concern for each country, particularly in terms of internal policy, because, without it, growth, welfare, and other vital features of a country are impossible to achieve. Peace is a goal for Afghans, who have lived through a decade of war, aggression, intervention, and immigration. During the four-decade war, Afghanistan's valuable assets were lost. They are all fighting a never-ending campaign of assassinations, explosives, suicide assaults, and military operations against Afghanistan's peace, democratic system, and people. Because they have powerful supporters, the government can't kill them, and as a result, people are concerned about Afghanistan's future. As a result, the situation has gotten more difficult, with few possibilities for peace. Afghanistan has endured a significant number of casualties in the pursuit of peace. Furthermore, not only has the country's political and economic well-being been harmed, but the younger generation appears to be in danger. (Liu Yuan, 2019)

China is emerging and playing a key role in contributing and establishing peace to develop its periphery in the current international system. It is Afghanistan's most significant neighbor, and due to the country's unstable political situation, China has concerns about the country's border with Afghanistan, where terrorists also pose a threat. According to its actions in Afghanistan, the potential and alternatives for Afghans to participate in the peace process discourse appear to be happening. China also believes that the Taliban's militant activities harm. In Xinjiang, there

are Uyghur Muslims. China always wants peace in Afghanistan and wants to keep the Taliban and other militant groups at bay. They want to maintain their asset in Afghanistan whereas the nation conjointly proscribing American influence. (Griffiths, 2017)

Aside from the support of Soviet governments from 1979 to 1989, which China wouldn't perceive, China has kept up with relations with every Afghan organization? In contrast to the capital of China (Beijing) denounced the Soviet incursion of Afghanistan. During the Afghan organization, it also remained authoritatively dormant in the country. China has criminal dealings or relations with the Taliban government, according to Afghan examiner Malik Setiz. (Setiz 2015)

After more than a year of discussions, the US and therefore the Afghan religious movement appeared to devise got a settlement within the fall of 2019. After more than 18 years of conflict, the Taliban and United States announced an agreement, which is known as the **"Agreement for Bringing Peace"**. The agreement was announced on February 29, 2020, in Doha, Qatar between the Zalmay Khalilzad United States special envoy and Taliban political chief Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar. (Idrees, M., Rehman, A. U., & Naazer, M. A. 2019). However, United States withdrew from the deal before it could be legally signed, claiming the death of an American war veteran as a result of a Taliban bomb. The talks are now formally on suspension, however, US Special Representative Zalmay Khalilzad continues to communicate with the Taliban through alternative options. The failure of a deal between the US and the Taliban, at least so far, has had several implications, including a disaster of Afghan elections, continued combat, a halt to the release of 5000 prisoners, and a substantial spike in civilian deaths. (Awan, 2020) As Abdul Ghani said,

"Afghanistan will not tolerate any activities on its territory that endanger China's (security)"

Furthermore, China plays a role in Afghanistan to demonstrate its desire. The demise of the peace talks has had an impact on the Afghan presidential election, which had been postponed for quite some duration. On September 28, 2019, the election was ultimately held, but not without much controversy and turmoil. If the peace deal had been ratified, the

election might not have taken place at all. While holding the election is a victory in and of itself, the election was so botched that the results if ever published, may cause more strife than if the elections had never been held. In the Discussions for Peace after more than a year of talks with the Taliban political chief Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar in Doha, Qatar, President Trump abruptly withdrew the US from the talks in September 2019, blaming the loss of an American soldier in a Taliban bombing. According to reports, President Trump also wanted the signing ceremony to take place at Camp David, a plan that the Taliban and many members of the US Congress opposed. (Farr, G. M. (2019).

Meanwhile, neighboring countries, particularly China, are hoping to play a role in Afghanistan's economic destiny. The Afghan presidential election is also trapped in the uncertainty of the unsigned peace deal. The election did not go well, and it did not resolve the issue of who should lead Afghanistan. Because of an open dispute between the candidates and evidence of widespread voting fraud, the election results have yet to be revealed as of this writing. The recent election in Afghanistan has revealed a deeper issue. The idea that political decisions are made by individual voting in an open election process does not work in a tribal society like Afghanistan. Long-established tribal processes are used to make decisions, notably political decisions. This procedure may appear undemocratic to Westerners, and it is, yet it has worked in Afghanistan throughout its history. (Khan, 2019), (The Express Tribune, 2019)

'We want peace, but not at any cost' writes an Afghan newspaper columnist.

For the last four decades, Afghanistan has been at war. To further its Communist colonizing agenda, Soviet powers conquered Afghanistan in 1979. In the 1990s, several segments of Afghan society waged a civil war to gain power in Afghanistan. The Taliban confiscated control of the capital of Afghanistan (Kabul) in 1996 associated decreed established an Afghan Government. Following the 9/11 attacks, the United States deposed the Taliban regime in 2001 and attempted to dissipate the extremist association in Afghanistan. America's struggle fare with Taliban militants is now in its nineteenth year, and those retain to die in Afghanistan. Despite the truth that the US and the Taliban have grasped

a settlement to carry reconciliation or peace to Afghanistan. (Muzaffar, et. al. 2019).

Literature Review

China's chief Wang Yi paid common visits to Kabul for the duration of the years 2014-2015. In February 2014 he provided China's technique ambition for Afghanistan to come to be a "unified, constant, growing and friendly" kingdom. He mentioned that China is inclined to play a precious role in creating a distinction in Afghanistan to accomplish, complete political compromise. In November 2014, the Chinese reverend of peace Guo Shengkun go to Afghanistan. China is keen to have relations with Afghanistan to reinforce regulation enforcement and protection cooperation, he stated. (Getty: Loyang, Dec 2015).

China additionally seeks to mediate talks among the Taliban and the Afghan authorities approximately a social manner, albeit it has to be highlighted that China is pursuing an "Afghan-led and Afghan-owned" social manner. China believes that it's miles able to such mediation as it has an extraordinarily excellent political picture in Afghanistan. Because it constantly indorses Afghan-controlled and Afghan-retained coverage, respects the country's freedom and independence, and actively endorses political settlement rounds. (Jin, Aug 2016).

On September 6, the Chinese Ambassador to Kabul Yao Jing paid for a go to the Badakhshan region, pronouncing riots in northern Afghanistan may be a danger to the region. (Sudha, Sept 7, 2017)

If certainly centered on and facilitated, those may have a transformative political, financial, and social effect on Afghanistan's future. (Andrew, July 2010)

In the academia, some authors highlights the significance of Afghanistan for China, in China's Political and Financial Objectives in Afghan. They also categorize Chinese interest into different groups. According to the author, China views Afghanistan via economic and security lenses. Cooperation between China and Afghanistan in the domains of security and economy is essential for regional stability. China is likewise concerned about militancy in Afghanistan (Khan, 2015).

Role of China and US in Afghanistan

The involvement of China and American in Afghan is also a key regional concern as well as it has significance on South Asian stability and peace. The competition between China and America in Afghanistan can be observed through the historical facts. Beijing and Washington are striving hard to outperform each other in every field to become the world's sole power. China is eager to assist Afghanistan in bringing stability to Kabul through economic and security cooperation. An ongoing rivalry involving China and the US in Afghan is also seen in the recent geopolitical atmosphere. (Imran, 2019).

China believes that Afghan security forces must be trained and equipped to handle the country's security and that foreign factors must assist in this regard. The SCO forum in 2018 was used to exert a lot of pressure on member states to participate in Afghan peace talks (Voltaire Network, 2018).

It demonstrates China's desire to participate in global security issues. It sees this as a roadblock to China's willingness to help restore peace to Afghan. Both the Chinese government or the US want peace and prosperity for Afghan, but their approaches to security differ. The security cooperation between China and Afghanistan demonstrates China's critical role in Afghanistan. The United States openly praised China's contribution to the Quadrilateral Dialogue, which was held to bring peace to Afghanistan. In the bigger picture, both the Chinese government and the US wish to eliminate terrorism, promote communication, and strengthen Afghan institutions. China has shown keen interest in road construction, agriculture, and other energy-related initiatives. Beijing has played an important role in bringing peace to Afghanistan, a neighboring country. Beijing has supplied Afghans with training in a variety of professions (Xiaoqiang, 2014).

China is committed to fighting terrorism, promoting economic activities, and assisting Afghanistan's institutional development. China has stated that its military involvement is limited to improving Afghan forces' capability and providing material and training. In 2014, the United States praised China's contribution to peace in Afghanistan. China is working on the economic front. China's efforts to increase its global effect include the Sustainable development Goals and the Eastern Economic Partnership. The United States believes that establishing a strong Afghan central government will strengthen Afghanistan's security. America finds it difficult to accept China's control in the region, but it also wants to remove its forces from Afghanistan and bring the protracted war to a close. Afghanistan's political and military history over the last 40 years, as well as interventions from two big powers, the Soviet Union and the United States, make it impossible for China to ignore the country.

Economic Relations between China and Afghanistan

In 2014, China gave Afghanistan a nice sum of 327 million dollars. China has begun several projects to benefit the local population. Two factors are posing challenges to China's efforts to bring peace to Afghanistan. China and Afghanistan are adjacent countries with a 76-kilometer border. There is no large city that is connected to the border areas on both sides, and the border areas are mountainous. The second factor is China's concern that its intervention in Afghanistan may cause unrest in its Xinjiang province. The establishment of a military post in Afghanistan is part of China's enlargement strategy (Toktomushev, 2018).

Afghanistan received \$19.5 million in debt relief from China (Spegele & Hodge, 2014). Both China and Afghanistan have 278 tariff-free commodities, and both countries are eager to expand their commercial connections. Due to Kabul's strategic importance, and trilateral negotiations including Beijing, Islamabad, and Kabul, Islamabad and Beijing's influence in Kabul is growing. China has always avoided interfering in other countries' internal affairs. The Chinese administration has denied that China's military base is part of a plot for Chinese imperialism. In actuality, China authorizes the formation of a brigade because of the necessity of security. Afghanistan and China are collaborating in a variety of fields to benefit each other. Kabul and Beijing are strengthening their economic ties, and China is also assisting Afghanistan with loans. Pakistan held a discussion process between the Afghan government and Taliban representatives before Mullah Mansoor's death in July 2015. The summit was also attended by senior officials from the United States, Pakistan, and China. It was a huge step forward in Afghanistan's peace process, and it has been recognized by important global investors. Just before the second round, the process was compromised by the murder of Taliban head Mullah Omar (Zia, 2016).

China's geo-economics is making real progress in adapting to changing state interaction patterns, which the growing interdependence and coexistence are the essential rules for survival, and isolationism is a thing of the past. Pakistan is doing everything it can to achieve peace in Afghanistan, despite numerous difficulties posed by India. Although

Afghanistan was not initially included in BRI, China's constant expansion in economic cooperation with Afghan and constructive participation in the Peaceful resolution indicate a shift in the Chinese perspective. Pakistan seeks stability in its neighbors because the Global Economic Corridor, part of China's infrastructure development, has been the most important component of China's global connectivity strategy (BRI). China declares its desire to stretch the CPEC towards Afghan through developing a land route in Jalalabad, Afghan, with Peshawar, Pakistani (Gul, 2018). China, as the country's largest foreign investor, is fully aware of any changes in the country (Bokhari, 2019).

Another important innovation since November 2018 is the Afghanistan-China air corridor. Other air routes with Indonesia, Saudi Arabia, Kazakhstan, Turkey, and India have now become available (Kelemen, 2020).

As a result, the reconciliation project would be seen by Chinese authorities as being the most remarkable development in the coming history. Afghanistan should take a proactive and crucial role in the nation's progress, since Ambassador Jin Song stated, by utilizing its benefits in terms of location, economics, population, contacts, and publicity (Zia, 2019, para. 7). Even though various BRI road and rail connectivity connections are still in the works, China is trying to advantage of the desire for a prosperous Afghan. Liu Jinsong (the former head of the Silk Road Fund), Afghanistan is an "important partner" in China's Belt and Road Initiative, according to China's ambassador to Afghanistan.

The eminent Peace Accord between the Taliban and America has supported on the 29th of February 2020 in Doha. Media and Peace building in Afghanistan

Since the fall of the Taliban in 2001, the Afghan media area has encountered emotional development in all spaces: TV, radio, print, web, cell phones. All things considered, the area holds enormous potential for making critical commitments to peacebuilding in the country. (Himelfarb, S. 2010)

The most recent few years has been pulverizing for Afghanistan and encompassing regions. It is likewise one of the heartbreaking nations that come up short on a harmony. The quantity of contention has expanded greatly since 20 years' conflict in Afghanistan. After the defeat of the Taliban system in the late 2001, Afghanistan engaged the global benefactors for reconstructing the Afghan culture and upgrade Peacebuilding among Afghans because of different methodology. (Hanif, 2015) However, the media area additionally goes up against various difficulties that block its capacity to understand this potential - which must be tended to through the joined endeavors and consideration of worldwide and homegrown partners the same. (Himelfarb, S. 2010)

Other huge regions for development: more prominent accentuation on quality and variety of programming (counting a requirement for more Pashto language programs), upgraded endeavors to give security to media specialists, more expert interchanges preparing for Afghan government authorities, and more broad examination and comprehension of Afghan media purchasers themselves.

Afghanistan Visions on China Reconciliation Mediation

Afghans have an unclear, unless completely blank, ancient knowledge of China's approach toward Afghanistan. These two neighboring countries have never had a boundary conflict, and China has never obstructed in country's inner dealings. China has maintained a purpose about its western border neighbor for many years. It has remained a bystander in Afghanistan, neither getting too close nor staying too far away. Within Afghan political debates, the Sino-Pak relationship is divisive. An Afghani political person, Ahmad Saidi, argues that China-Pakistan relationships will affect China's actions and render its ceasefire efforts ineffectual. They claim that Pakistan will take advantage of the chance to strengthen Pakistani politics and safeguard its future impact.

Hamid Karzai, the ex-Afghan head of state, encouraged China to become further involved in Afghan-Taliban peace talks. His spokesman, though, cautioned current President Ashraf Ghani's government of Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI)-led discussions after he left office. They claim that Pakistan exploits China.

Abdul Baqi Amin, University of Kabul's professor, has attacked the Karzai management for weakening to accomplish any achievement in peace talks with the Taliban and increasing mistrust in the peace process and Sino-Pak cooperation. He goes on to say that the current uptick in Taliban consular connections could be free of Pakistan's impact because the Taliban themselves desire to establish good relations with additional countries (Amin 2014).

Even though the peace process is supported by a large majority of Afghans, China can help the peace process by exerting influence over members of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization who are critical of the negotiations. Talking to the Taliban, according to this approach,

entails ignoring all of the group's atrocities during the last two decades. They also claim that talks give the opposite side legitimacy, something some rebel groups badly want (Byman 2009: 125). 'We want peace, but not at any cost,' writes an Afghan newspaper columnist. He also feels that pursuing the Taliban will not lead to a settlement.

The bulk of Afghan political groups appear to accept China's push for peace talks, although some are worried about Pakistan's impact on the Taliban discussions. Women's rights activists express their worry, saying, "It is apparent that women's rights have been a low priority [in peace talks]" (Donati 2014). The Afghan Human Rights Commission also urged the government that independence of appearance, Afghanistan's composition, civil liberties, human rights, women's rights, and abundant principles would not be jeopardized in peace discussions with the Taliban.

Afghanistan's government wants to take the lead in the peace process, and China appears to be on board. In October 2014, President Ghani traveled to China for the first time, where he urged China to play an important part in the Afghan-Taliban peace discussions. Hong Lei, a spokesperson for China's Foreign Ministry, stated in January 2015 that "China supports the "Afghan-led and Afghan-owned" process" (Wong and Mashalmy 2015).

Taliban Indecisiveness

The survival of non-Pashtun unified old-style anti-Taliban groups, Northern Association, in government, according to analyst Nasser Saghafi Amiri, is an extra reason for state inconsistencies in the peace procedure. As the Taliban's primary enemy in the past, this set is reported to make up over 60% of Afghanistan's Army, according to Amiri, who trusts it "would undoubtedly fight any concessions to the Taliban impacting ethnic Tajiks or Uzbeks." (Amiri et al., 2015). Nonetheless, despite numerous doubts of trailing their freehand risks with the arrival of the Taliban, calls for negotiations with them have so far been met with no official opposition from non-Pashtun political organizations.

Lu Shulin, the Chinese ambassador to Pakistan, met Mullah Omar in Kandahar in December 2000. He reassured China that the Taliban will not "allow any group to utilize its territory to execute any such

operations” in contrast to the country. In return, the Taliban lead sought "two things from China: formal political recognition and immunity from United Nations sanctions." Neither side, however, followed through on their commitments. China did not practice its veto to stop UN approvals on the Taliban, and Uyghur terrorists remained in Taliban-controlled areas (Small, 2013). Despite this, China maintained ‘on-again, off-again relations with the Quetta Shura, the Taliban's Pakistani governance circle. Beijing is attempting to isolate Uyghur separatists by maintaining ties with Afghan rebels, and the Taliban may exhibit a lot of admiration for China because they already have "enough rivals" (Small, 2013).

Wakil Ahmad Mutawakil, a former Taliban foreign minister, believes China may play an effective part in peace discussions and cooperation enlistment among Afghanistan's political groups.
